

Through The Grapevine: Wine Society

Hello Summer!

Wine Society will take a break for the Summer and will resume our wonderful meetings in September.

This is a recap of our fantastic wine meetings in May and June.

MAY featured wines from Spain - *Vino De Espana*.

Our first course of Shrimp Carpaccio, Crispy Chorizo, Grapefruit, Smoked Cauliflower puree paired with the Juan Gil Red Blend.



TYPE OF WINE Aged Red VARIETAL 45% Cabernet Sauvignon 45% Monastrell 10% Syrah

TASTING NOTES: Hints of spicy nuances that complement the ripe black and red berry aromas. A flash of sweet strawberries with dusty tannins on the medium-bodied palate, with a fruity finish. Good balance and structure, this wine may be enjoyed now and has the components to drink well for a few years.

VINEYARDS The vineyards are head-pruned, dry-farmed old vines planted at an average elevation

of 2,000 feet above sea level. The yields are low and all hand-picked. No herbicides or pesticides are used in production. The wine spends 12 months in a selection of French and American oak barrels.

Our Second Course was an amazing Braised Beef, Espagnole Sauce, Mirepoix, and Beef Tallow Potatoes paired with the *Atteca Garnacha Armas*.

GRAPE VARIETY Garnacha

The grapes come from selected plots of old Garnacha vineyards with low yield, producing grapes with a higher concentration of aromas and fruit loads, located high on the hillsides in mainly decomposed slate and gravelly clay soils. After carrying out the alcoholic fermentation in small stainless-steel tanks at a controlled temperature, it is aged for 18 months in new French oak barrels, thus obtaining a limited production of this exclusive wine.

TASTING NOTES: Dark picota cherry with an attractive nose in which the aromas of ripe fruit appear, the roasted and spicy notes

of a long aging in wood (pepper and nutmeg), and the mineral memories of the slate soils in which the vineyard is born. On the palate, it is tasty and powerful, fruity and elegant, meaty and complex; it is superbly drunk, although it shows great aging potential. **FOOD PAIRING** Wine of great versatility that can be paired with grilled red meat, game meat, or creamy rice, game stews, poultry, roast, cured and blue cheeses, serrano ham, charcuterie, mushrooms, small game stews, and pork.

The 3rd Course: Praline Crème Brûlée, Pistachio Semifreddo and Espresso Chantilly Cream paired with the **Croft Tawny Reserve Port**.

The Croft Reserve Tawny is drawn from wines selected for their smoothness and mellow character. These are aged for up to seven years in oak casks in Croft's cellars. The individual wines are then blended together a few months before bottling for balance and completeness.

TASTING NOTES: Light brick red, with an amber hue. On the nose, rich red fruit, notes of caramel, raisins and cloves. On the palate, cardamom, spice, butterscotch and elegant redcurrant, interwoven with attractive nutty aromas. Smooth and round on the palate, full of luscious strawberry jam flavours and an elegant finish.



In JUNE, we featured wines from the **Failla Winery**.

ABOUT: Failla is the personal project of winemaker and farmer Ehren Jordan, dedicated to crafting expressive wines from cool-climate vineyards along the Sonoma Coast and renowned sites in Oregon.

Ehren's path to winemaking was anything but conventional. After graduating college in 1989, he began in wine sales in Denver before heading to Aspen, where he split his time between skiing and working in the restaurant scene rising from busser to sommelier by season's end.

A spontaneous road trip to Napa Valley led him to the doorstep of Joseph Phelps Vineyards, where a temporary tour guide role turned into a three-year deep dive into all facets of the winery—from cellar work to retail and sales under the mentorship of Bruce Neyers.

In 1993, his passion for old-world winemaking took him to France's Rhône Valley, where renowned oenologist Jean-Luc Columbo took him on as an apprentice. There, on the steep hillsides of Cornas, Ehren embraced traditional techniques and helped craft wines for Columbo and his clients during two challenging vintages.

Ehren's hands-on journey—spanning restaurants, cellars, and vineyards across continents—infuses Failla with an independent spirit and a focus on site-driven, soulful wines.

With 34 harvests under his belt, Ehren has now paved an influential path in the California winemaking world with his long resume of notable winemaking and viticulture jobs, leading to the honor of Winemaker of the Year in 2008 and continual high scores from critics. Marcassin, Neyers Vineyards, Turley Wine Cellars (winemaker for 18 years), and, of course, his own labels, Failla

(established in 1998) and Day (established in 2011), all make up his versatile journey. (Winery)

Our First Course was a wonderful Seared Diver Scallop, Avocado, Marcona Almond, Grapefruit, and Compressed Honeycrisp Apple paired with the **Failla Chardonnay – Sonoma Coast**.



Cool-climate Chardonnay from a star of the Sonoma Coast, Ehren Jordan. The fruit is sourced from Olivet, Keefer Ranch, and Flood Gate vineyards.

With its spine of sappy brightness and crystalline salinity, this wine displays all the dense, bright, and savory appeal of marine-influenced, wind-swept Sonoma Coast.

The Second Course was a Braised Wagyu Beef Shank "Enchilada", Luxardo Cherries, Mole Rojo, Smoked white Cheddar Mornay paired with the **Failla Pinot Noir – Sonoma Coast**.



"Failla is a reference point winery for the Sonoma Coast. This is as good as it gets." — Antonio Galloni, Vinous Media. This elegant Pinot Noir from the cool Sonoma Coast displays wild berry fruit with earthy and savory undertones. Very Burgundian in style.

Our Third Course was a Pate Sablee, Chocolate Raspberry Pinot Cake, Buttercream, and Coulis paired with the Failla Pinot Noir – Willamette Valley.



The grapes in Failla's Willamette Valley Pinot Noir hail from four impeccable vineyards of the Northern Willamette Valley: Amity Hills, Seven Springs, Björnson, and Eola Springs. The vineyards range in diverse terroir as well as ideal mature vines to add layers of complexity. Fermentation occurs through native yeast, and 25% is whole cluster. The wines age for 14 months sur lie in 10% new French oak before being bottled unfined and unfiltered.

Aromatically, the wine has nuances of rose petals, orange zest, cranberries, and pomegranate seeds. On the palate, the wine has mouth-watering acidity and well-structured tannins that tie together with flavors of fresh mushrooms and brambly red berries.
