

The board for 2026 will be having our planning session in January, so mark your calendars for our next meeting on February 5, 2026. Our meeting is held on the first Thursday of each month.


The adventure continues and I am confident that we will continue to reach new exciting times ahead. I wish you and your families a joyous holiday season and a happy New Year!

# Through The Grapevine: Wine Society

## The 2025 Wine Society: September & October Tasting Recap

### September 2025 Wine Tasting:

**DOURTHE**  
BORDEAUX

#### Maison Dourthe Bordeaux

In September, the Wine Society explored the offerings of Dourthe, a distinguished French producer of Bordeaux wines. Maison Dourthe, founded in 1840, has established itself as a dedicated steward of Bordeaux's rich terroir. Their commitment is evident both in their own vineyards and in collaboration with partners, consistently striving to share the diversity of Bordeaux and create innovative wines for the future.

#### First Tasting: La Grande Cuvée Bordeaux Sauvignon Blanc

The evening commenced with La Grande Cuvée Bordeaux Sauvignon Blanc, crafted entirely from Sauvignon Blanc grapes. This wine is noted for its fresh and aromatic character, presenting vibrant citrus aromas of lemon and grapefruit complemented by an elegant mineral nuance. On the palate, it evolves into a richly textured, lively experience, culminating in a



fruity and persistent finish.

#### First Course: N°1 Bordeaux Rosé & Confit Pork Belly

The first course paired N°1 Bordeaux Rosé with confit pork belly, smoked tomato jus, pickled fennel, and Brussels leaves. This rosé, made exclusively from Cabernet Franc, stands out for its pale pink hue, delicate fruit-driven aromas, and lively, zesty flavors. The wine's freshness adds a charming dimension to the pairing.



#### Second Course: Chateau Grand Barail Lamarzelle Figeac Saint-Emilion Grand Cru & Grilled Yellowfin Tuna

For the second course, we enjoyed Chateau Grand Barail Lamarzelle Figeac Saint-Emilion Grand Cru—composed of 70% Merlot and 30% Cabernet Franc—paired with grilled yellowfin tuna, tempura asparagus, rice, and yuzu BBQ sauce. The wine's deep ruby color and fruity aromas of strawberry and blackberry are accented by floral notes of violet. On the palate, it presents a fresh, well-balanced profile with a



delicate structure and fine, well-integrated tannins.

#### Final Course: Chateau Roumieu Sauternes & Honey Lemon Cheesecake

The final course featured Chateau Roumieu Sauternes, a blend of 89% Semillon, 10% Sauvignon, and 1% Muscadelle, served with honey lemon cheesecake, toasted coconut, and white chocolate. This wine is notable for its smooth, concentrated palate, delivering aromas of dried currants, dried fruit, and honey.



### October 2025 Wine Tasting:



**DUMOL**

#### DuMol Winery, Russian River Valley

The October tasting showcased the wines of DuMol Winery from California's Russian River Valley. The 2023 vintage is regarded as one of the region's greatest, distinguished by its cool climate and extended growing season. With no heat stress, the fruit developed complexity and intensity while maintaining acidity and purity. These wines promise to be enjoyable both upon release and after years of aging.

# Through The Grapevine: Wine Society

## First Tasting: Wester Reach Chardonnay & Risotto



The session began with Wester Reach Chardonnay, paired with risotto, Blue Hill Bay mussel, fumet, and pecorino. The Chardonnay offered soaring aromatic intensity—white flowers, thyme, anise, ginger, and

citrus fruits. On the palate, flavors included lime juice, white peach, toasted almond, and briny green olive. Its crystalline mineral acidity balanced the wine's richness and broad texture, leading to a lingering finish of citrus oil and oyster shell. Recommended drinking window: 2025–2033.



## Second Course: Wester Reach Pinot Noir & Braised Beef Cheek



The second course featured Wester Reach Pinot Noir Russian River Valley, paired with braised beef cheek, confit fingerling potatoes, root vegetables, and Espagnole. This Pinot

Noir is highly perfumed, blending fresh summer berry notes with anise, pine needle, and dark cherry. The style is both pure and fresh, with lifted floral spice. Flavors transition from Bing cherry to wild blackberry, orange zest, and cardamom. The palate is broad and layered, offering elegant power, fine lacy tannins, and vibrant acidity, finishing with pure, fruity energy. Recommended drinking window: 2025–2035.



## Final Course: Wild Mountainside Syrah & Rich Chocolate Torte



The final course paired Wild Mountainside Syrah Russian River Valley with a rich chocolate flourless torte, dark chocolate mousse, Merlot cherry coulis, and cocoa nibs. The Syrah exhibited a multi-dimensional aromatic range including violet, lilac, blue and black berry pastille, white and black pepper, and olive tapenade. The palate was densely packed with ripe blue and black fruits, sweet herbs, and exotic spices. Its soft, round texture enveloped a youthful structure, with lingering notes of dusty cocoa and licorice spice. Decanting for an hour is recommended in its youth. Recommended drinking window: 2025–2035.
