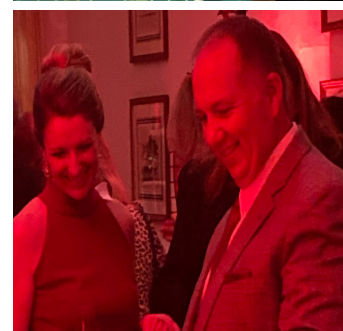
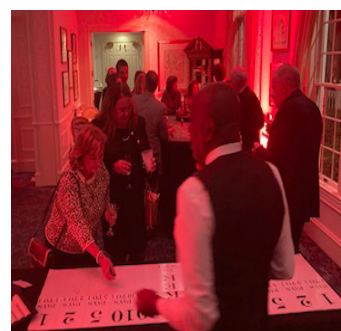
Sara Campbell Fashion Show | November 6th

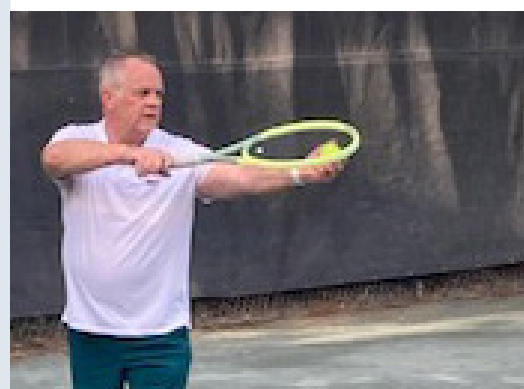

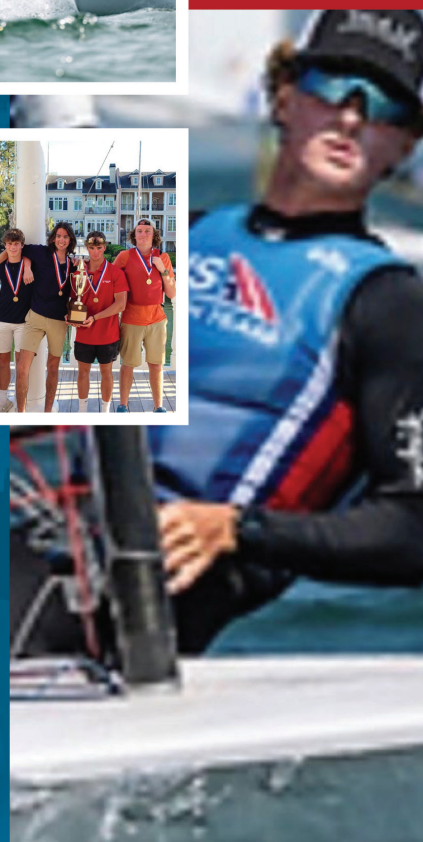

Through The Grapevine: Wine Society

Happy New Year Wine Society!

Our Wine Society Tasting Meetings in 2025 featured fabulous wine and food. As always, Chef Nick and his fantastic team created excellent dishes to pair with the wines. Thank you, Chef Nick!

The Grande Finale in November was fantastic!

Our First Course paired the **Nozzole Bruniche Chardonnay** with Sweet Potato Carpaccio, Golden Beets, Apple Relish, Leeks, Crème Fraiche, and Caviar.



Le Bruniche is a fresh, fruity, and mineral Chardonnay crafted at Tenuta di Nozzole. Exceptionally versatile, it pairs beautifully with light aperitifs and more sophisticated dishes, making it a perfect choice for any occasion.

Grape & Land

Grape variety: Chardonnay
Production area: Tuscany
First vintage: 1986

Tasting Notes

Color: light straw yellow
Nose: apple, apricot, nectarine and melon flavors
Mouthfeel: smooth and creamy texture. The palate closes clean and fresh.

Our Second Course paired the **Cipressi Nizza** with Cavatelli al ragu di Coda alla Vaccinara. Fresh Cavatelli, Braised Oxtail Ragu, Pancetta, Aged Goat Cheese, Calabrian Chili Cremolata.

"While in other works, they were mentioned only as present, here the cypress was the protagonist. I experienced their charm and imagined them as a mythical element with long shadows... then I remembered certain rainy harvests, the tiring transport of the baskets in the still wet soil, so I matched them to the substance, to the roughness of the earth".

Aging: Minimum of 18 months. Aged for 12 months in large oak casks before refinement in the bottle

Color: Bright ruby red

Nose: Surprising for its clarity and elegance, red fruit, mature cherry, raspberry and

the sweet notes of tobacco

Tasting Notes

Full, well-structured, harmonious; an impressive wine with its fresh softness and final savory and round flavor.

Accompanies: Cured meats, pasta with meat sauce, risotto, fillet, guinea fowl, medium-aged goat cheeses.

The Third Course paired the **Sette Ponti Crognolo** with Antipasto of Taleggio, 16 Month Aged Gouda, Sopressata, and Capicola. Accompanied by Marinated Artichokes, Olives, and Grilled Bread

First made in 1998, it takes its name from a wild plant that grows abundantly on the estate, the Cornelian cherry or Cornus mas. This wine strongly represents the vision of its creator, intending to valorize the territory and innovation achieved through



evolving traditions. The base of the wine is Sangiovese – from clones from the oldest vineyard on the estate, Vigna dell'Impero, which was planted by Amedeo, Duke of Savoy-Aosta in 1935. This historic

variety was grafted in vineyards with stony soils rich in marl. We carefully select the best Sangiovese grapes, which make up more than 90% of the wine. We add a small quantity of Merlot, which gives smoothness, immediacy, and color to the wine.

Tasting Notes

The intense red ruby color is a prelude to ample aromas of ripe cherries and wild berries, well blended with spicy notes that give the wine class and complexity. Round, distinctly harmonious and vibrant on the palate, it shows depth and perfect tannins.

Through The Grapevine: Wine Society

Our Fourth Course paired the Agricola Punica Barrua with Rosemary Crusted Lamb, Grilled Domestic Lamb, Sea Island Red Peas, Carrots, Cabernet Gastrigue, and Anice Jus

Barrua is a red wine with the I.G.T. Appellation of Isola dei Nuraghi. It comes from native grapes and French varieties, vinified in purity, from spurred cordon vineyards



cultivated in Basso Sulcis. It is a wine with an intense and lively ruby-red color, with complex aromas of ripe red fruit (mainly black cherry), spices, notes of licorice and hints of myrtle. This elegant wine shows impeccable workmanship.

Origin: Red wine of typical Sulcis grapes with a modest addition of French varieties, vinified in purity from the spurred cordon vineyards grown in Basso Sulcis in our Narcao and Barrua farms.

Color: lively, deep ruby-red; nature's gift.

Perfume: complex scent of ripe red fruit (mainly black cherry), spices, notes of licorice and hints of myrtle.

Flavor: an elegant wine that shows impeccable workmanship; notes of sage and myrtle with aromas of ripe red fruits and pepper in a persistent and harmonious finish.

We finished the evening with

"Cookies & Milk", Brown Butter & Rum Biscotti, Pistachio Gelato, Chocolate.

Robin and I are working together this year to come up with more exciting tastings.

More information will come out soon about the upcoming year.
